- Adopting Ordinance
 - Board of County Commissioners
 - City Council
 - Ballot Initiative
- Once ordinance is adopted, enforcement can occur.
- Bernco owned or controlled property or land:
 - Please also be advised that entering or remaining upon lands owned, operated, or controlled by the Bernalillo County and/or City Of Albuquerque knowing that consent to enter or remain is denied or withdrawn is a criminal trespass under NMSA 1978, Section 30-14-1(C), which may subject you to arrest and a possible misdemeanor conviction and civil damages.
- Zoning Ordinance for privately owned vacant land:
 - Unpermitted occupation or use of land prior to the issuance of a county permit. (Section 24.C.3.a. of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of Bernalillo County)
 - Occupation of vacant and undeveloped land is not a permissive use. Any and all occupation must cease immediately.
 - Recreational vehicle on the property used for dwelling purposes. (Section 7.B.2.e. of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of Bernalillo County)
 - A recreational vehicle may be temporarily occupied for up to two (2) weeks in any calendar year and may only be served by electricity for lighting purposes. Please cease use of the RV currently on the property by (date; two weeks from initial inspection).





Legal Ramifications

- Consultation with your Legal Counsel, Law Enforcement, and Executive Leadership is necessary to avoid any due process issues.
- If adopted ordinance is in place and established, it can give local law enforcement the ability to prosecute through criminal trespass on Jurisdiction owned or controlled property.
- Grants Pass v. Johnson decision
 - Supreme Court ruled that cities enforcing anti-camping bans, even if homeless people have no other place to go, does not violate the Eighth Amendment's prohibition on cruel and unusual punishment.
